What is the current situation?

1. Taiwan

In 2005, Taiwan published <Refugee law> draft to secure the safety of refugees around the world. From 1975 to 2017, Taiwan has received over 10,000 refugees from Southeast Asia.

2. Germany and Austria

Recently, Germany and Austria authorities allow refugees to study in local universities for free.

3. United States of America

In 2017, President Donald Trump ended DACA, a controversial Obama-era immigration program that gave refugee children a chance to work and study in U.S.A without fear of deportation.



4. Tent Schools International

This Christian organization provides children refugees with a temporary but safe place to stay in Syria and Kenya. There are volunteers helping kids read and write Arabic and English.



5. UNHCR

Since 2012, UNHCR has partnered with the Educate A Child (EAC) programme, which makes sure that host countries give refugee students national education.



How can education reduce war?
